Questions to ask:

THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION (WACE)

The Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) is awarded to senior secondary students who satisfy its requirements. Generally students will need to complete Year 11 and 12 to complete their WACE, although there is a degree of flexibility in this.

West Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) Requirements	
Completion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete 20 units over Year 11 and Year 12, where one subject equals two course units. E.g. Year 11 Math Methods Unit 1 and 2. Completion of four Year 12 ATAR courses OR a Certificate II qualification OR a combination of ATAR and General courses.
Achievement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Achieve 14 C grades with 6 coming from Year 12. Completion of qualifications and/or endorsed courses of study are the equivalent of C grades in Year 11 and 12, as outlined in the table below.*
Literacy and Numeracy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pass the NAPLAN or OLN (Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment).
Breadth of Study	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete 10 Year 12 course units. Complete Year 11 and Year 12 English. Completion of subjects from both list A (English/History/Geography) and list B (Mathematics/Sciences/Technology).
Exams	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students sitting ATAR courses must sit exams. Students studying General courses do not have to sit external examinations.

VET: A student's perspective

School is great! I only have to attend Monday to Wednesday and on Thursday and Friday I go to TAFE or work. School work hasn't really become harder or easier, but my workload has become more manageable. I only study three subjects; Math, English and Career and Enterprise. The Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation is my elective. This allows me to develop outdoor skills, as well as leadership, teamwork and confidence; qualities I know will be useful when seeking employment. I get to do all this in a Christian environment with teachers that genuinely care for me.

I chose the Certificate II in Hospitality at the South Regional TAFE in Year 11. After completing this, I had a lot of different options open to me. I have a casual job as a barista and could have kept training in this industry, but I chose to broaden my horizons by completing a Certificate II in Community Pharmacy through a School Based Traineeship.

Part of the VET program is getting as much work experience as you can to prepare you for the workforce. I get paid to attend Work Placement and receive industry training from the Pharmacy Guild.

I really enjoy the flexibility of school and work. I am totally work ready!
