GRACE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL EDUCATION OUTCOMES

Evidence of a successful education program can be measured in many ways. Students can be encouraged by outcomes of our past students. These outcomes lead to further education at university and TAFE as well as employment post school.

ATAR Achievement

In 2024 50% of eligible students received an ATAR score over 80 (inclusive of regional bonuses). This placed them in the top 20% of students, with 25% receiving an ATAR over 90. Our school Dux received a regionally adjusted ATAR of 99.95 and achieved direct entry in to the prestigious UWA Doctor of Medicine via Bachelor of Biomedicine (Minimum selection rank of 98.00)

University Applications and Acceptance

In 2024 all of our ATAR students and 25% of our vocational students applied to university via TISC. 100% of these received their first preference of university and course.

Vocational Education and Training Outcomes

Whilst 78% of our Year 12 students in 2024 completed a vocational qualification, for 56%, this was their main focus. Our top vocational student completed two qualifications including a Certificate IV in School Based Education Support. She has now progressed onto a Bachelor of Education (Primary) at ECU Bunbury.

PASTORAL CARE AT GRACE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

Students as Individuals

Pastoral care is an essential aspect of education offered at Grace Christian School. This care is based on a deep respect and love for the dignity and uniqueness of each individual child, created in the image of God and designed to fulfil their God-given potential.

Staff

Our dedicated Christian staff strive to develop safe and healthy relationships with our students. This initial level of pastoral care is integral to maintaining a positive learning environment, acutely aware, "no significant learning will ever happen without significant relationship."

Deputy Principal (Secondary) and VET Coordinator

Grace is also unique in that the Deputy Principal (Secondary) partners with the Vet Coordinator, whose role it is to assist staff and closely monitor students progress and achievement.

Student Executive Team

Prefects provide a point of contact for students to voice their cares and concerns and have these communicated and addressed by the Head of Student Management (Secondary) and Principal through fortnightly meetings.

Pastoral Care Team

A team comprising the School Chaplain, Student Services, Learning Enrichment, Deputy Principals and the Principal monitor the progress and wellbeing of students regularly throughout the year.

School Chaplain

Our Chaplain offers counselling in a confidential setting to both students and their families.

First Aid

Administration staff and a number of teaching and support staff are trained in First Aid and offer first response medical care and associated support, ensuring the welfare of our students.

Camps

Our Year 11 Camps provide exciting opportunities and experiences for our students coupled with unique opportunities for personal challenges, pastoral input and faith based guidance.

House System

The house system places students at the beginning of their journey at Grace Christian School into one of three houses: Banksia; Jarrah; or Peppermint. Each house is led by a Head of House (staff) and House Captains (students).

Home Groups

These groups are facilitated by a home group teacher enabling students to form relationships, strengthen connections with peers in their year group, provide a forum for discipleship, safe discussion, friendships, goal setting, mentoring and celebrating. Home Groups meet on a daily basis for devotions and administrative tasks.

Course/VETIS Program Completion	 Complete at least 20 course units or their equivalent. Completion of a full-year course of study will contribute two course units. Minimum completion of four Year 12 ATAR courses or a Certificate II qualification. 			
Course/Endorsed Program Achievement	 Achieve 14 C grades in Year 11 and 12 with at least 6 units being completed in Year 12. Completion of VETIS or Endorsed courses of study will be the equivalent of C grades in Year 11 and 12, as outlined in the table below. 			
Literacy and Numeracy	 Demonstrate a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy through NAPLAN or OLNA. Testing may continue through Year 11 and 12 until this is accomplished. 			
Breadth of Study	 Minimum of 10 Year 12 course units or their equivalent. Two pairs of Year 11 and Year 12 English units. Completion of one pair of Year 12 course units from each of list A (English/History/Geography) and list B (Mathematics/Sciences/Technology). 			
Examinations	 All students taking ATAR courses must sit external examinations. Those completing 6 courses in Year 12 can apply to be exempt from 1 examination. Students studying General courses do not have to sit external examinations.

- **VET program**, studying General courses at school and vocational qualifications through a Registered Training Organisation (RTO)



There is a strong correlation between academic performance in Year 10 and academic achievement in Years 11 and 12. Students selecting courses which require higher standards of work than they have displayed in the past, would be counselled against such choices.
